Coordinating Organisation - Applicant

- **A consortium must be led by an applicant = the coordinating organization**
 - ✓ **The applicant submits the proposal on behalf of the beneficiaries.**
 - ✓ **The applicant is responsible for the overall implementation of the project.**

Sectors of activities

Lot 1 and Lot 2 proposals are open to all sectors except of the six pilot sectors of Lot 3.

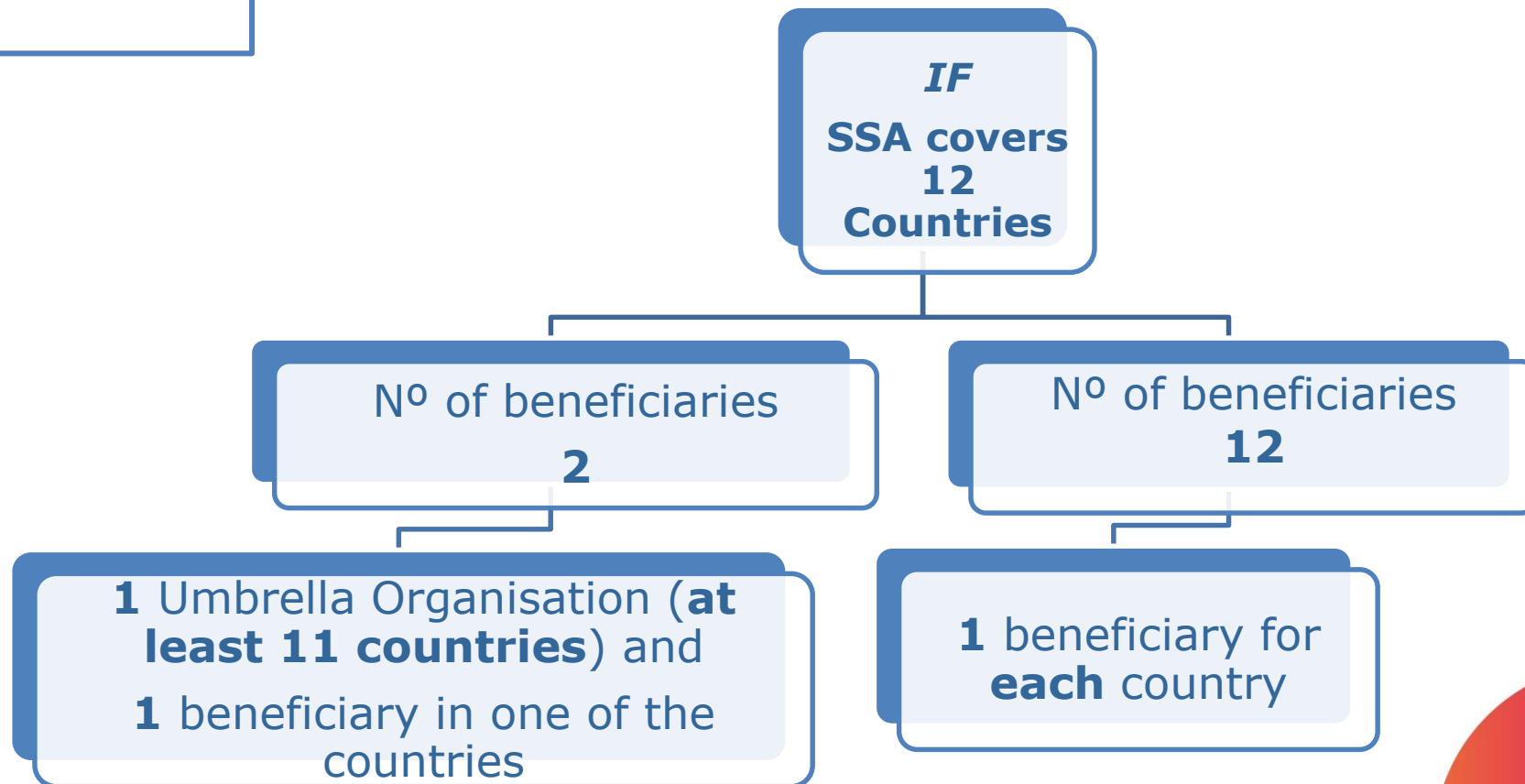
Type of participating organizations

Public or private organisations established in a **Programme Country** such as:

- European and/or national social partners;
- labour ministries or associated bodies (agencies or councils);
- public or private employment services;
- labour market research institutes, national statistics offices;
- public or private, small, medium or large enterprises (including social enterprises);
- economic development agencies;
- chambers of commerce, of industry or of labour;
- sectoral or professional associations of employers or employees; chambers of skilled crafts;
- European or national sectoral umbrella organisations;
- training or education providers at local, regional or national level;
- sector-based research institutes;
- bodies providing career guidance, professional counselling and information services;
- public authorities responsible for education and training at regional or national level.
